Intelligence Narrative No. 342, Day Operation, 12 Sept. 1944.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 09:10 hours, 21 B-26's took off to bomb Defense Position, Firenzuola Area, Area NFQ (M/R: (W) L-891069, Sheet 98, GSGS 4164), Italy. 4 B-26's returned early: 3 Spares; 1 because of oil leak. 17 B-26's were over the target and 8 dropped 240 x 100-lb demolition bombs (instantaneous fuses) and 9 dropped 1050 x 20-lb fragmentation bombs on the target at 11:11 hours from 11,300' to 10,800' on an axis of 06 degrees. 16 B-26's returned to base at 12:53 hours and 1 B-26 was lost; crashed on landing due to flak damage; crew safe.

C. Results: The target area was missed. The bombs landed in a good pattern NE of the river fork just W of the target area.

F. Comments: 3 A/C carrying fragmentation bombs carried only 19 clusters of 6, and one A/C carried only 18 clusters of 6.
