Intelligence Narrative No. 350, Day Operation, 16 Sept. 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Berge.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0905 hours, 50 B-26's took off to bomb the Defense Area North-West of Rimini, bounded by points R-820957, R-822959, R-839960, R-843956, R-837937, GGS 4164, Sheet 100, Italy. 2 B-26's returned early: 1 due to mechanical trouble and 1 due to personnel. 48 B-26's were over the target and 20 dropped 390 X 100 lb G.P. bombs (inst. nose & no delay tail fuse) and 27 B-26's dropped 3204 X 20 lb. frag bombs on the target at 1134 hours from 11,000' to 9400' on an axis of 212 degrees T. 120 X 20 lb frags having hung were salvoed by 1 A/C in target area and 36 X 20 lb. frags were salvoed in water due to emergency. 10 X 100 G.P. bombs were returned to base after having hung. 43 B-26's returned to base at 1345 hours. 1 B-26 returned at 1430 after landing in Italy for gas; 4 B-26's headed to Italy to refuel and returned to base at 1543 hours.

C. Results: The assigned target area was well covered with a good concentration of bombs.

Target: S, H, ~~A~~, ~~I~~, N. CP encountered from bombs away to breakaway.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather: (and Vicinity of Target)

A. Enroute: Broken towering cumulus over northern Sardinia, tops 15,000 feet and above extending westward over the Tyrrhenian Sea for 15 miles. From there, stratus cumulus at 8,000 feet, breaking to clear near coast of Italy and inland to Appenines. Over western Italy, 5-7/10 stratus cumulus at 8,000 feet, with occasional cumulus tops building up through it, breaking to clear over the Adriatic.

B. Target: A clear strip extending 8-10 miles inland from the Adriatic left target open.

C. Return: Same as enroute.

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E. Routes: Base to Montalto Di Castro to Pesaro to $44^{\circ} 30' N - 12^{\circ} 40' E$, I.P., 1st and 2nd Squadrons bore left; 3rd Squadron bore right and 4th and 5th Squadrons direct; all Squadrons to the target; break left, right curve to Pesaro to base.
