Intelligence Narrative No. 356, Day Operation, 23 Sept., 1944

Flight Commander: Lt. Weeks.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 09:15 hours, 12 B-26's took off to bomb Colleccchio Storage Dump (M/R: (V) P-999788, GSOS 4164, Sheet 73), Italy. No early returns. 12 B-26's were over the target and 12 B-26's dropped 96 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 10:31 hours from 9,600' to 9,100' on an Axis of 63°T. Two runs were made on the target. No bombs were dropped on the first run due to bombardiers check point having been bombed out, and all bombs were dropped on the second run. 12 B-26's returned to base at 11:34 hours.

C. Rambla: An excellent bomb pattern almost completely covered the target area, scoring direct hits on at least 4 storage tanks. The target area was in flames as the formation broke from the target.
