Intelligence Narrative No. 357, Day Operation, 23 Septem. 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Smith.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 09:35 hours, 19 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Borgoforte Railroad Bridge (M/R: (R) F-446114, G3G3 4164, Sheet 62), Italy. 1 B-26 returned early being a spare. 18 B-26's were over the target and 18 B-26's dropped 72 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 11:16 hours from 9,600' to 9,100' on an Axis of 178°T. 18 B-26's returned to base at 12:44 hours.

C. Results: An excellent pattern of bombs covered the bridge, scoring several direct hits on the structure.

c. Flak:

Target: M, H, I, I, -OP Encountered by second Squadron from time bombay doors opened to breakaway - total of 40 seconds. First Squadron encountered flak only on the breakaway, for 15 seconds.

Villafranca: M, H, I, I, Long deflection shots.

Castel S. Giovanni: S, HM, I, I, Fired through clouds.

d. Skimming: None.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: 1 due to flak.

4. Weather:

) Borgoforte: Broken cumulus, tops 5-6,000'. Altostratus

c. Target Area: : overcast at 11,500 - 12,000'. Vis. 5 - 6 miles in haze.
