Intelligence Narrative No. 363. Day Operation. 1 Oct. 1944

Flight Commander: Captain Dosty.  
Lead Pilot: Captain Claybough.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 10:00 hours, 19 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Peschiera RR Bridge (M/R: (R) E-417547, S/NOS 4164, Sheet 48), Italy. No B-26's returned early. 19 B-26's were over the target and 19 B-26's dropped 76 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 11:44 hours from 9,750' to 9,250' on an Axis of 152° T. 19 B-26's returned to base at 12:54 hours.

C. Results: An excellent concentration of bombs covered the bridge, scoring several direct hits. The bridge is believed down or definitely impassable as the result of this attack.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: Several B-25 and B-26 formations were seen bombing in the target area.  
b. Situation: Ghedi A/V appeared serviceable.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) Explosion, possibly crashed a/c, 1 mile South of Fiorenzuola D'Arda at 11:05 hours.  
(2) Road bridge at Fiorenzuola appeared up.  
(3) Pontoon bridge under construction just South of Cremona RR bridge.  
(4) RR bridge out; Road bridge up; Pontoon bridge being constructed at Pontecivio.  
(5) Fires and gray smoke in vicinity of Pestrengo at 11:44 hours.  
(6) Fuel dump near Cremona appeared badly damaged.

b. Communications:

- (1) 10 RR cars at Castelvento Piacentino.  
(2) Train of 12/10 cars headed West at Oiari at 11:22 hours.  
(3) 400 RR cars scattered in vicinity of Oiari and Rovato.  
(4) Train of 4/5 silver-colored cars headed South-West at Lograto at 11:22 hours.  
(5) 75 RR cars at Brescia.  
(6) 300 scattered RR cars in vicinity of the target.  
(7) 20 M/T moving North at Manerbio at 11:18 hours.  
(8) Considerable scattered M/T traffic in the vicinity of Cremona, Brescia, and the target, moving in all directions between 11:15 hours and 11:55 hours.  
(9) 25/30 M/T moving South-West out of Cremona at 11:08 hours.

- c. Flak:  
Villafranca Di Verona: S, N, A, I. long deflection shots.  
Fired on breakaway, behind formation.
- d. Spinning: None.
- e. Losses: None. Damaged: None.
- f. Weather: CAVU in all areas.
- g. Routes: Base to join up at Pianosa; to landfall at Monoglia; to Cremona; to island in Lago Di 'Iseo; to South-West tip of Lago Di 'Idro; to ip. Gardone River; bomb run, to target on an Axis of  $152^{\circ}$ T; breakaway sharp right; curve left to Volta Mantovana; to Cremona; to Monoglia; to base.
