Intelligence Narrative No. 769, Day Operation, 11 Oct. 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Bennell D/H; i;
Lead Pilot: Lt Bennell. Major Maynard

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 14:32 hours, 20 B-26's took off to bomb Munition Factory at Bologna (M/R: (W) L-901468, CGS 4164, Sheet 87); 3 B-26's returned early, 2 spares and 1 engine cutting out. 17 B-26's were over the target and 17 dropped 136 x 500-lb demolition bombs (.1 and .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 16:04 hours from 12,000' to 11,000' on an axis of 335 degrees. 17 B-26's returned to base at 17:10 hours.

C. Results: An excellent pattern of bombs covered the target area, scoring many direct hits on installations, no large explosions were seen.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity: 1 FW 190 headed North Southeast of Bologna, 1000' below formation, reported by one crew member at 16:07 hours. P-47's were seen in target area.
b. Situation: None.

2. Ground:

a. General: None.
b. Communications: 200 RR cars at Bologna.
c. Flak:
Pianoro to Target M, I, H, A, A GP 10/12 H at L-9046 and 3 H at L-9445.
Encountered 90 seconds before bombs away end for 3 minutes on breakaway and leaving target area. Accuracy increased to maximum at instant of bombs away. Both gray and black bursts were seen.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: 13 to flak.

4. Weather: Excepts: Scattered cumulus at 4-6,000 feet, becoming broken over Apennines, tops 7,000', occasionally building to 15,000, but dissipating on northern slopes. Visibility excellent.

Target Vicinity & Target Area: 1/10 small cumulus, bases 4,000', tops 6,000'. Targets open. Visibility 5-6 miles in haze in Po Valley.

Return: No Change.

E. Routes: Base to landfall at Pollarica; to Pontecchieve; to IP, Castel Del Rio; to target on axis of 335 degrees; breakaway sharp right to Castel Del Rio; to Base.
