Intelligence Narrative No. 179, Day Operation, 13 Oct., 1944.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 10:10 hours, 17 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Padua Railroad Bridge South (A/R: (4) C-310469, CGCs 4164, Sheet 50), Italy. No B-26's returned early. 17 B-26's were over the target, but no bombs were dropped due to cloud overcast. 17 B-26's were over the target at 11:54 hours from 10,000' to 9,500' on an Axis of 135°T. All bombs were returned base. 17 B-26's returned to base at 13:36 hours.

a. Baroclinic: Broken cumulus, bases 3-4,000', tops 9,000', occasional tops 12,000' over Appenines. Scattered cumulus at 6,000' from Fiorenzuola to Lake Garda. 8-9,000' tops, 8-9/10ths Stratus and Stratocumulus in eastern Po valley.

b. Target Vicinity:

&) In Lake Garda region, 6-7/10ths cumulus, bases on mountain

c. Target: tops 10,000'. Target obscured in Venice area, 8-9/10ths stratus, tops 7,000', target obscured.

d. Return: General lowering of cloud bases and building up of cloud tops observed.

E. Routes: Base to landfall at Moneglino; to Fiorenzuola Di Ada; to Desenzano Del Garda; to Malcesine; to one mile North of Ala; to target on an Axis of 135°T; Breakaway right to Ala; reciprocal course to base.
