Intelligence Narrative No. 377. Day Operation, 15 Oct., 1944

Flight Commander: Captain Deatly.
Lead Pilot: Captain Claybough.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 08:45 hours, 19 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Calcinate Railroad Bridge (M/R: (R) M-191605, GACB 4164, Sheet 47), Italy. 1 B-26 returned early: Spare. The first Squadron did not drop on the first run, because of failure to definitely identify the target (Confusion with nearby bridge) and made a second run on the target. 18 B-26's were over the target and 9 B-26's dropped 35 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the first run at 10:14 hours from 9,000' to 8,500' on an Axis of 35°T. 9 B-26's dropped 35 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the second run on the target at 10:31 hours from 9,600' to 9,100' on an Axis of 10°T. 2 x 1,000# Demolition bombs were salvoed in water on return, having hung up over the target. 18 B-26's returned to base at 11:23 hours.

C. Results: Two good patterns covered the bridge and both approaches. After photos confirm that first Squadron tore a large hole in the bridge and cratered the West approaches. The Second Squadron also scored direct hits on the bridge and East approaches.

4. Weather: Same as that in Narrative No. 376 except in the target vicinity: Broken Stratus at 2,000' in Northern Po Valley covered I.P. and the O.P., but broke to clear on the bomb run.

E. Routes: Base to Moneglia; to Pidanza; to I.P., Asola; to target on first run on an Axis of 35°T; breakaway right to Asola; to target on second bomb run on an Axis of 10°T; breakaway right to Asola; to Pidanza; to Moneglia; to base.

F. Comments: None.
