Intelligence Narrative No. 383. Day Operation, 19 Oct., 1944.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M)

B. At 12:53 hours, 19 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Ossenigo Railroad Fill (M/R: (R) F-589795, CGGS 4164, Sheet 48), Italy. 1 B-26 returned early: spare. 18 B-26's were over the target and 17 B-26's dropped 134 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 14:35 hours from 10,600' to 10,000' on an Axis of 37°T. 10 x 500# "demolition bombs" were returned to base; 2 having hung up over the target, and 8 due to bombardier error. 18 B-26's returned to base at 15:48 hours.

C. Results: The target was covered with an excellent concentration of bombs, scoring several direct hits. A few bombs hit just West of the target in the water.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity: 2 Me-109's, two miles South of Peschiera when formation was headed North, came in high at 12 o'clock to 1,000 yards, but made no pass, then passes under the formation and were seen from the rear headed down in a steep glide, at 14:22 hours. German markings were seen.

b. Situations: An unidentified A/C was seen fired at by flak over Verona, and crashed on West outskirts of the city at 14:18 hours.

2. Ground:

a. General: Peschiera RR Bridge appeared passable.

b. Communications:

- (1) 30 RR cars at Peschiera.
- (2) 90 RR cars between Peschiera and Verona.
- (3) 40/50 RR cars North of Dolce.
- (4) 20 RR cars at Dolce.
- (5) 10/15 M/T headed South toward Garda at 14:34 hours.
- (6) 9 M/T, stationary, East of Lenato, at 14:46 hours.
- (7) 3 trains of 10 cars each, headed East in vicinity of Garpaneto at 14:15 hours.

c. Flak: None.

d. Shipping: Hospital ship North of Desenzano at 14:41 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damage: None.

4. Weather: See Narrative No. 381.

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E. Routes: Base to landfall at Mondeglio; to Fidenza; to Lazise; to Target; breakaway left to Desenzano; to Fidenza; to Mondeglio; to base.
