CASSANO DI ADSA RE BRIDGE (M/R: (9) K-499680, 0808 4164, Sheet 46), Italy.

At 14:15 hours, 3 g-26's took off. No H-26's returned early or were lost prior to the target. 3 H-2's were ever the target. No bombs were dropped on the target, because the fluk concussion tumbled the gyro in the lead a/c. 3 g-26's were over the primary target at 15:51 hours from 9,000' on an axis of 558°T. 4 x 1,000% Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) were salvoed in the target area, because of fluk damage to a/c carrying them. 8 x 1,000% Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses - 7 of these) and (6-hour delay fuses - 1 of these) were returned to base by the other two a/c.

3 g-26's returned to base at 16:46 hours. No B-26's lost or missing.

1 B-26 slightly damaged by flak, and 1 g-26 seriously damaged by flak.

RESULTS: None.

ENERY AIR OFFOSITION: None.

FLAK: I. H. A. A. Barrage followed by CP type flak encountered from target. Flak was encountered from 1 minute short of the bomb release line and for thirty seconds into breakeway.

ROUTE: Base to Moneglia, P-4088; to Castel S. Giovanni, K-4118; to IP, Lodi, K-4846; to target on axis of 358°T; breaksway right over Treviglio, K-5768; to Lodi, K-4846; reciprical course to base.

WEATER: A. Enroute: Very scattered cumults at 8,000.

B. Vicinity of Target: CAVU.

C. Target Area: CAVU.

D. Return: CAVU.

AIR OBSERVATIONS: Air Activity: P-47's were seen at Moneglia, P-4028 at 18:32 hours.

SPECIAL COMMENTS: This Flight led 2 other flights, each breifed to bomb gun positions with fragmentation bombs, East and West of the Target. All 8 a/c carried chaff. This formation dropped 12 boxes of chaff between IP and the bomb release point (see Chaff Interrogation Report to follow). 18 a/c followed this squadron, attacking a larger bridge just gast of this flights target. 1 crew member was injured by flak.
