At 1415 hours 3 B-26's took off. No B-26's peturned early. No B-26's lost over or prior to target. 3 B-26's were over the target. 3 B-26's cropped 360 x 20 lb free bombs on the primary target at 1551 hours from 9.100' on an axis of 140 T. No bombs were salvoed. No bombs were returned to base. 3 B-26's returned to base at 1649 hours. No B-26's lost. No B-26's missing. No B-26's alightly damaged or otherwise.

RESULTS: Hombs covered an area just south west of the guns positions, with a few possibly walking into the north-west edge of the area.

ENEMY AIR OPPOSITION: None.

MAK: S-M. H. I I GP type flak was encountered from the target. Commanced just before bomb run, and continued for 30 seconds into breakaway.
