320th Bombardment Group(M).

SAN MARGHINITA RAILROAD BRIDGE (M/R: (R) F-664926, GSRS 4164, sheet 36), Italy.

At 11:50 hours, 20 B-26's took off. 2 B-26's returned early: spares. No B-26's lost prior to the target. 18 B-26's were over the target. 9 B-26's dropped 69 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) and 3 x 500# Demolition bombs (.6-hour delay fuses) 1 mile North of the target, South-West of Marco at (M/R: (R) F-674982, GSRS 4164, Sheet 36), 13:30 hours from 11,600' to 11,100' on an Axis of 150°T. 9 B-26's dropped 69 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) and 3 x 500# Demolition bombs (.6-hour delay fuses) on the Primary target at 13:38 hours from 10,900' to 10,400' on an Axis of 148°T. No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. 15 B-26's returned to base at 15:03 hours, and 2 B-26's returned at 16:01 hours, after escorting missing a/c. No B-26's lost. 1 B-26 is missing. (Last seen on single-engine at 4,500', flying on a course of 230°, at 14:00 hours, with 2 P-47's escorting, over Ostia, P-7157.) 9 B-26's slightly damaged by flak. 1 B-26 seriously damaged by flak.

RESULTS: The target was missed. The bombs landed just North of the target. Bombs of the first Squadron cut the RR tracks South-West of Marco at M/R: (R) F-674982.

MISSING FLIGHTS OR POSITION: None.

FLAK: 1. H, A, A, -GF type flak encountered from Rovereto, A-7003, and Mori, A-6801, by the first Squadron. Encountered 30 seconds before bombs away and through the breakaway over Rovereto. Some 105 mm. bursts were seen.

2. H, A, FA, -GF type flak encountered from North of the target and Rovereto, A-7003, by second Squadron. Encountered for 1 minute on the bomb run, stopped on the breakaway.

3. H, A, A, A, encountered passing over the target on the return.

From Genoa: 30 bursts of heavy, barrage type flak, behind 2 escorting a/c, flying South 7 miles East of Genoa.
