AVISIO RAILROAD VIADUCT (M/R# (R) A-747304, GSRS 4164, Sheet 21), Italy.

At 08:02, hours, 40 B-26's took off. 4 B-26's returned early: Spares. No B-26's were lost prior to the target. 36 B-26's were over the target. 18 B-26's dropped 66 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) and 6 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (6-hour delay fuses) on the Primary target at 10:17 hours from 12,600' to 11,600' on an Axis of 240°T, by the first two Squadrons. The last two Squadrons did not drop due to inability to identify the target adequately for a bomb run, because of smoke screen and heavy haze. 6 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (12-hour delay fuses) were salvoed in the water on the return. 66 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) were returned to base, not having been dropped due to smoke screen and haze. 36 B-26's returned to base at 11:36 hours. No B-26's were lost or missing. 6 B-26's slightly damaged by flak. No B-26's seriously damaged.

RESULTS: Bombs landed over to the South-West and short to the North-East of the target, missing it.

GERMAN FIGHTER OPPOSITION: None.

FLAK: M, H, H, A, 1, -GP type flak encountered from North of Trento, A-7725, when the formation was over the target. Came up in bursts of 4 and 7. Encountered 30 seconds before bombs away, through the breakaway. About 5 bursts of yellow centers were seen.

Light flak was inaccurate for both altitude and deflection. Light flak was fired from hills just West of the target.

ROUTE: Base to Moneglia, P-4028; to Fidenza, P-9094; to Montichiari, P-1853; to P-3098; to Tione d' Trento, A-4721; to San Antonio Di Mari, A-5238; to B-1240; to Cavalese, B-0547; to IP, Caprana, A-9646; bomb run to target on an Axis of 240°T; breakaway left to A-6237; to Tione d' Trento, A-4721; reciprocal course to base.

WEATHER:

- a. Enroute: Clear.
- b. Vicinity of the Target: Clear with haze over Po Valley.
- c. Target Area: Clear with heavy haze.
- d. Return: As enroute.

AIR OBSERVATIONS:

a. Air Activity:

(1) 1 P-38 at 20,000' headed North just over Monzambano, I-4020, at 09:30 hours.

(2) 8 P-47's rendezvoused over Alba and provided excellent escort over the entire route.

b. Situation: Ghedi A/D, I-0957, appeared unserviceable, with 2 white crosses in center of runway at 09:42 hours.

(2) 35/40 RH cars East of Cremona, at I-6326, at 09:38 hours.

(3) Train with 12 cars, moving South, at Borgo Val di Taro, I-6453, at 09:32 hours.

(4) Train of 10 cars moving South at I-7666 at 09:33 hours.

(5) 3 repair cars at Pidenza, I-9094, at 09:33 hours.

(6) Short passenger train, stationary, at Lonato, I-2658, at 09:42 hours.

(7) 300 RH cars at Brescia, I-0568, at 09:43 hours.

(8) 40 RH cars at Vabarno, I-2678, at 09:45 hours.

(9) 200 RH cars between Rovereto, A-7004, and Trento, A-7824, at 10:00 hours.

(10) 2 W/T convoys of 25 units each, one moving East, and one moving West, at Borgo, B-0521, at 10:06 hours.

(11) 6 W/T moving South at I-2665 at 10:22 hours.

(12) 15 W/T, stationary, at Desenzano, I-3058, at 10:23 hours.

(13) 15 W/T moving East from Ghedi at I-1252 at 10:25 hours.

AIRCRAFT COMMENTS: A/C which crash landed at Borgo, 16 November 1944, was not lost. It is now considered repairable, though seriously damaged. Delete one lost; add one seriously damaged by flak, on Final Mission Report No. 415, 16 November 1944.
