320 th Bombardment Group (M).

TARGET: NEUSTADT N/Y. (M/R) (S) R-302635, GSRS 4416, Sheet D-2, Germany.

At 1311 hours, 26 B-26's took off. 1 B-26 returned early: Propeller governor out. No B-26's were lost prior to the target. 27 B-26's were over the target and dropped 212 x 500-lb demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the primary target at 1446 hours from 11,000' to 10,000' on an axis of 49 Deg. True. No bombs were salvoed. 4 x 500-lb demolition bombs were returned to base having hung up over the target. 27 B-26's returned to base at 1626 hours. No B-26's were lost, none missing, and none were slightly or seriously damaged.

RESULTS: Bombs were dropped on "NTA", due to cloud cover and poor visibility. Heavy haze and ground fog prevented visual run on any target, as the ground was visible, through holes in the clouds, only from directly overhead. Bombs were released 4 minutes 12 seconds past IP, on an axis of 49 Deg. True. Air Speed 185 MPH. Photos show that bombs landed 1/2 miles North-East of Neustadt, at (S) R-314845, cutting tracks and two roads. 2 large explosions were seen.

FLAK: None Encountered. a. I. H. Barrage type flak seen fired from Kaiserslautern, (S) R-0294.
b. S. H. type flak seen fired from Landau, (S) R-2767.

ROUTE: Base to Nancy, (V) U-118; to Monacaheim, (S) Q-9316; to Haguenau (W) R-0424; to IP, Annweiler, (W) R-1766; to target on an axis of 49 Deg. True; breakaway left to Saverne (W) Q-7316; to base.

WEATHER: A. ENROUTE: Dijon to Nancy, 5/10ths thin stratus and altostratus at varying heights between 6,000' and 12,000'.

B. VICINITY OF TARGET: Over Vosges Mountains, broken deck of thick strato-cumulus on mountain tops, breaking directly over the target. Visibility, two miles in heavy haze and ground fog in all areas.

C. TARGET AREA: Same.D. RETURN: As Enroute.

AIR OBSERVATIONS:

- a. Air Activity: (1) At Arrasourt (N) Q-1115, unidentified A/C was seen to hit ground and explode; 5 chutes were seen in the air, at 15:16 hours.
(2) No escort rendezvoused.
(3) P-47's were seen strafing in the target area.
(4) One twin-boomed unidentified A/C, was seen over Igwiller, (N) Q-7130, at 14:33 hours.
(5) A/C burning on ground; 1 chute descending in vicinity at (N) Q-7671, at 14:43 hours.
