HONBERG RAILROAD BRIDGE (W/R: (a) W-368573, GSGS 4416, sheet X-2), Germany.

320th Bombardment group (H).

At 13:10 hours, 27 B-26's took off to bomb Hornberg Railroad Bridge (W/R: (a) W-368573, GSGS 4416, sheet X-2), Germany. 2 B-26's returned early: engineering. Total sorties 25. 25 B-26's were over the Primary target and 24 B-26's dropped 96 x 1,000-lb. demolition bombs (.1 & .01 second delay fuses) on the second run on the target. (No bombs were dropped on the first run, because the formation was not in position to drop), at 15:06 hours from 12,000' to 11,000' on an Axis of 164°T. No bombs were salvoed. 4 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs were returned to base, not having been dropped due to bombardier error. No B-26's were lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 25 B-26's returned to base at 16:18 hours.

ROUTE: Base to rendezvous at Juneville (N) 0800; to Arstein (N) N-9450; to IP, Zell (N) N-2472; briefed axis of 152°T; 5° drift correction to the right; evasive action; loss of altitude; to target on the first run; curve right to IP, Zell (N) N-2472; to target on second run on an axis of 164°T; breakaway right to Zell (N) N-2472; reciprocal course to base.

WEATHER:

- a. route: 7/10ths to 8/10ths low clouds bases estimated from 3,000' to 4,000', tops 6,000'. 7/10ths cirrus.
- b. Vicinity of Target:
 -) 2/10ths low clouds, tops 6,000' to 7,000',
- c. target Area : No estimate on base.
- d. return: Same as enroute. Vis. 10 miles. Winds aloft 265°; 35 m.p.h..

RESULTS: The target was missed. A good pattern cut the North approaches and blocked the tunnel mouth.
