320th Bombardment Group (H).

At 10:42 hours, 32 B-26's took off to bomb Hornberg Railroad Bridge (N/A: (W) W-368573, OSGS 4416, sheet 1-2), Germany. 1 B-26 returned early: Generators out. Total sorties: 31. 31 B-26's were over the Primary target and 31 B-26's dropped 123 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs (,1 & ,01 second delay fuses) on the Primary target on the second run at 13:46 hours from 14,000' to 13,000' on an axis of 218 T. No Bombs were dropped on the first run, because they could not obtain alignment on the target due to cloud cover at the "IP". 1 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bomb was salvoed at 13:46 hours at the target area, having hung up. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 31 B-26's returned to base at 14:12 hours.

ROUTE: Base to rendezvous at Luneville (W) 4-0600; to St. Die (W) V-4166; to Gielestat (W) V-7862; to 1 mile south of briefed IP, Herbolzheim (W) V-0357; to target on first run (Briefed Axis of attack - 89°T; 7° drift correction to the left; evasive action; loss of altitude); to Rottweil (W) W-6752; left turn to Bernhan (S) W-5773; to target on an Axis of 215°T; breakaway right to Erstein (S) V-9680; to base.

WEATHER:

- a. enroute: 8/10ths to 10/10ths cumulus to Luneville with bases at 2,000' and tops at 7,000', building up to 13,000' to 14,000' east of Luneville and becoming 10/10ths except for area - (covered in the next paragraph).
- b. vicinity of Target:
- c. target area : Area 50 to 60 miles square over the target where there was 4/10ths to 5/10ths clouds. Vis. 10 miles or better over the target.
- d. return: As enroute.

RESULTS: Bombs of the first squadron landed south of the target. Bombs of the second squadron landed short to the east. Bombs of the third squadron started short and walked over the bridge, scoring at least one probable hit.
