STRASBERG RAILROAD STATION (M/R: (W) X-005543, GeGs 4416, sheet X-3), Germany.

At 11:56 hours, 6 B-26's took off to bomb Strassberg Railroad station (M/R: (W) X-005543, GeGs 4416, sheet X-3), Germany. No B-26's returned early. Total sorties: 6. Due to weather over the Primary target 6 B-26's were over a target of opportunity, St. Georgen (M/R: (W) W-455475), and 6 B-26's dropped 35 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (1 & .025 second delay fuses) and 6 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (6 hour and 12 hour delay fuses minus anti-removal device) at 13:32 hours from 10,300' on an Axis of 41°T. 7 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs, due to bombardier error, were salved at 13:32 hours in the target area. No bombs were returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. 1 B-26 was damaged by flak. 6 B-26's returned to base at 15:04 hours.
