STANDENBUHL RAILROAD BRIDGE (M/R; (N) M-172098, GCS 4416, sheet U-2), Germany.

At 10:16 hours, 30 B-26's took off to bomb Standenbuhl Railroad Bridge (M/R; (N) M-172098, GCS 4416, sheet U-2), Germany. 2 B-26's returned early; 1 spare; 1 engineering; and 1 spare of this formation circled and joined the 2nd formation at rendezvous. Total sorties: 27. 27 B-26's were over the Primary target and 9 B-26's dropped 72 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .025 second delay tail fuses) on the first bomb run at 11:51 hours from 10,500' on an axis of 345°T., and 18 B-26's dropped 144 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .025 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 12:01 hours from 11,600' to 10,800' on an axis of 343°T., on the second bomb run. Two squadrons were not in position, and were not positive of identification of the target on the first bomb run. No bombs were salvaged or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 27 B-26's returned to base at 13:10 hours.
