320th Bombardment Group (H).

IMMENDINGEN M/Y (M/R: (H) W-741267, GOGS 4416, sheet 1-3), Germany.

At 12:50 hours, 30 B-26's took off to bomb Immendingen M/Y (M/R: (H) W-741267, GOGS 4416, sheet 1-3), Germany. 3 B-26's returned early: spares. Total sorties: 27. No B-26's were over the Primary target, due to 10/10ths undercast in the target area. 9 B-26's were over a target of opportunity, wooded area, at (H) #249238 and dropped 63 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) and 9 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (6hour and 12hour delay minus anti-removal device) on the target at 15:16 hours from 11,500' on an axis of 310°T. 18 B-26's were over a target of opportunity, M/Y, at (H) W-312228 and 9 B-26's dropped 59 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) and 9 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (6hour and 12hour delay minus anti-removal device) on the target at 15:05 hours, from 11,200' on an axis of 170°T. 9 B-26's broke left, after following 1st Squadron of 9 B-26's bombing, with bombay-doors closed, and made a second run. 8 B-26's dropped 56 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) and 8 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (6 hour and 12 hour delay minus anti-removal device) on the target at 15:16 hours from 10,500' on an axis of 170°T. 4 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) were salvoed at 15:06 hours at M/Y (H) #312228, having hung up. 1 x 500-lb. Demolition bomb (6 hour delay minus anti-removal device) was salvoed in lake south of base, due to delay fusing of bomb. 7 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) were returned to base, because the bombay-door failed to open over target. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 27 B-26's returned to base at 16:05 hours.

GROUND OBSERVATIONS:

a. General:

- Barrage balloons at #3122 at 15:05 hours.
- Barrage balloons at #2518 at 15:15 hours.
- Possible supply depot or lumber piles near factory at #3540 at 15:10 hours.

- 100 RR cars in M/Y at #3525 at 15:06 hours.

(2) 40 RR cars at W-3638 at 15:12 hours.

CASUALTIES: None.

NO. OF A/C TAKING PHOTOS: 8.

ROUTE: Base to Spinal, rendezvous; to St. Die; to Selestat W-7963; to Epenheim W-0360; to Bleibach W-1947; to Neustadt W-3623; to Bonndorf, CP, W-4613; to Blumberg, IP, W-6115 (briefed Axis over IP - none; evasive action over IP - none; drift correction over IP - none); sharp right turn to Blumberg; to Neustadt area. Formation split into 3 squadrons of 9 A/C each and bombed separately. The Squadron bombing at 15:05 hours did a 360° turn over the target area after bomb run; to Neustadt; reciprocal course to base. Remaining 2 squadrons joined up over Neustadt; to Bleibach; reciprocal course to base.

WEATHER:

a. enroute: : Clear with haze to Spinal. 7/10ths stratus-cumulus, bases topping hills, tops 5,000', over Vesage, breaking to 5-6/10ths over the Rhine valley.

b. vicinity of target: : 7/10ths stratus-cumulus, bases topping hills, tops 5,000', over Black Forest area. Occasional breaks.

c. target area: : 10/10ths stratus-cumulus, bases topping hills, tops 5,000'. Breaks in Neustadt area left target of opportunity open, although coverage was 7/10ths in the area.

d. return: : same as enroute to Spinal. Spinal - Bijon a thick low stratus-cumulus band moving into the area from the North-West.

RESULTS: Squadrons bombing W/I at (W) W-312228 covered area with an excellent concentration of bombs, cutting the tracks.

Bombs of other Squadron struck wooded area at (W) W-249238 and no results were observed.

SPECIAL COMMENTS: wooded area at (W) W-249238 was bombed because lead pilot noted concentration of barrage balloons over area and decided it was a military installation of some sort.
