At 13:04 hours, 21 B-26's took off to bomb Immendingen M/Y (M/R: (a) W-741267, CGGS 4416, sheet X-3), Germany. 3 B-26's returned early: spares. Total sorties: 18. No B-26's were over the Primary target, due to weather. 9 B-26's dropped 63 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) and 9 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (6 hour and 12 hour delay minus anti-removal device) on a target of opportunity, M/Y, at (W) W-312228 at 15:21 hours from 10,400' on an Axis of 184°T. 9 B-26's dropped 63 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay fuses) and 9 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (6 hours and 12 hour delay minus anti-removal device) on a target of opportunity, Rail Line and Factory, at (W) W-339245 at 15:20 hours from 10,000' on an Axis of 155°T. No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 18 B-26's returned to base at 16:27 hours.
