SIEGELSBACH AMMUNITION DUMP (M/R: (W) R-949747, GOGs 4416, Sheet U-3), Germany.

At 11:45 hours, 50 B-26's took off to bomb Siegelsbach Ammunition Dump (M/R: (W) R-949747, GOGs 4416, Sheet U-3), Germany. 5 B-26's returned to base early: 1 engineering; 4 spares. Total sorties: 45. 45 B-26's were over the Primary target and 33 B-26's dropped 260 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .025 second delay tail fuses) and 3 B-26's dropped 24 x 500-lb. M-17 Incendiary clusters with (M-138 fusing set at 19 seconds delay) at 13:55 hours from 11,600' on an axis of 32° T, on the first bomb run. The second formation of 18 B-26's made a second bomb run on the Primary target and 9 B-26's dropped 72 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .025 second delay tail fuses) at 14:04 hours from 10,400' on an axis of 29° T, as one squadron was below bombing altitude and was unable to bomb due to prop wash from first formation. 4 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs were salvoed at 13:57 hours on the breakaway, having hung up over the target. No bombs were returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 45 B-26's returned to base at 15:19 hours.

RESULTS: An excellent concentration of bombs blanketed target area. Explosions and resulting fires with smoke to 5,000' were reported by crews. Fighter escort called formation leader and reported additional explosions had been observed after the formation had left the target area. 4 fires were observed in the target area.

SPECIAL COMMENTS: On Missions of 24 February 1945, 6 B-26's which returned early, as spares, salvoed 6 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (6 hour and 12 hour delay minus anti-removal device), due to delayed fusing, in a lake south of base.
