SIEGFRIED LINE DEFENSES EAST OF ZWEIFBRUCKEN, Areas 17A, (M/R: (W) Q-757708, GSGS 4416, Sheet V-2), Germany.

At 06:48 hours, 18 B-26's took off to bomb Siegfried Line Defenses East of Zweibrucken, Area 17A (M/R: (W) Q-757708, GSGS 4416, Sheet V-2), Germany. 1 B-26 returned early: engineering. Total sorties: 17. 17 B-26's were over the target and 9 B-26's dropped 126 x 250-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) on the primary target at 08:11 hours from 11,500' on an axis of 25°T., and 8 B-26's dropped 112 x 250-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) on a area (W) Q-670173, due to misidentification, at 08:12 hours from 11,000' on an axis of 25°T. No bombs were returned or salvaged. No B-26's damaged. 17 B-26's returned to base at 09:36 hours. No B-26's lost or missing.
