SIEGFRIED LINE DEFENSES EAST OF ZWEIBRUCKEN, Areas 9A, 7A, and 5A (N/R: (W) Q-757708, GSOS 4416, Sheet V-2), Germany.

At 08:53 hours, 20 B-26's took off to bomb Siegfried Line Defenses East of Zweibrucken, Areas 9A, 7A, and 5A (N/R: (W) Q-757708, GSOS 4416, Sheet V-2), Germany. No B-26's returned early. Total Sorties: 20. 20 B-26's were over the Primary target and 20 B-26's dropped 158 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (Inst. nose & non-delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 10:32 hours from 12,000' to 11,000' on an Axis of 360°T. No bombs were diveded or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 20 B-26's returned to base at 11:37 hours.
