SIEGFRIED LINE DEFENSES AREA AND TOWN OF ERLBACH (M/R: (W) R-092568, GSGS 4416, Sheet V-2), Germany.

At 06:44 hours, 40 B-26's took off to bomb Nieder Schlettenbach (M/R: (W) R-085538, GSGS 4416, Sheet V-2), Germany. 1 B-26 returned early: propeller governor out. Total Sorties: 39. 20 B-26's were over the first Primary target, Nieder Schlettenbach, and dropped 270 x 250-lb. Demolition bombs (Inst. nose & non-delay tail fuses) on the second run on the first Primary target at 08:40 hours from 11,500' to 10,500' on an Axis of 23°T. The entire formation had been instructed to bomb the second Primary, Erlbach, but the first Primary target was bombed, due to bombardier error. 19 B-26's were over the second Primary, Siegfried Line Defense Area and town of Erlbach (M/R: (W) R-092568, GSGS 4416, Sheet V-2), Germany, and dropped 300 x 260-lb. Fragmentation bombs on the second Primary target on the first bomb run at 08:27 hours from 10,900' to 10,000' on an Axis of 13°T, under last minute instructions. 8 x 250-lb. Demolition bombs were salvaged at 08:40 hours at the target, having hung up. No bombs were returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. 39 B-26's returned to base at 09:32 hours.
