HEIDELBERG RAILROAD BRIDGE (M/R: (W) R-673907, GSOS 4416, Sheet U-3), Germany.

At 10:47 hours, 27 B-26's took off to bomb Heidelberg Railroad Bridge (M/R: (W) R-673907, GSOS 4416, Sheet U-3), Germany. No B-26's returned early. Total Sorties: 27. 27 B-26's were over the Primary target and 27 B-26's dropped 106 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .01 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 12:46 hours from 12,300' to 11,300' on an Axis of 257° T. 2 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs were salvoed at the target at 12:46 hours, having hung up. No bombs were returned. 1 B-26' lost: The lead A/C, Battle No. 27, was hit over the target by flak in the left engine. It dropped it's bombs on the target, fell out of the formation, to the right, going into a dive. The nose wheel lowered, just before the dive commenced. Three men emerged and opened chutes while a/c was in the dive. The a/c crashed and exploded, at (W) R-7582. 2 chutes landed in Heidelberg, and 1 in wooded area at (W) R-7182. No B-26's missing. 11 B-26's slightly damaged by flak. 1 seriously damaged by flak. 26 B-26's returned to base at 14:08 hours.

FLAK: S-M, H, A, A, -CP type flak encountered from the target. Commenced 40 seconds before bombs away and continued for 50 seconds into breakaway. Bursts of 4 were seen. The flak was stacked in layers at several altitudes at which the Squadrons were flying.

Losses to flak: 1. Damaged by Flak: CAT. I - 11.
CAT. II - 1.

GROUND OBSERVATIONS: See Report No. 529, this date.

GASUALTIES: Killed - None; Wounded - 3; Missing - 6.

No. of A/C TAKING PHOTOS: 6.

ROUTE: Same as Report No. 521, this date, except here Axis was 257° T (briefed Axis-
254° T; drift correction - 03° left; evasive action - loss of 1,500' altitude).

WEATHER: See Report No. 529, this date.

RESULTS: The third Squadron obtained an excellent concentration of bombs on the target, scoring probable direct hits. The first two Squadrons bombs landed over to the West.

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SPECIAL COMMENTS: A/C, Battle No. 27, missing from mission, 20 March 1945, is now confirmed to have been lost. The crew having bailed out over the SAAR Battle front. An 8th A. F. Combat Cameras Unit cameraman riding this mission, reports that he took a motion picture of the loss of A/C reported for this mission (22 March 1945).
