NECKARELZ RAILROAD BRIDGE (M/R: (W) S-069613, GSGS 4416, Sheet U-3), Germany.

At 10:06 hours, 29 B-26's took off to bomb Neckarelz Railroad Bridge (M/R: (W) S-069613, GSGS 4416, Sheet U-3), Germany. 3 B-26's returned early: 2 spares; 1 engineering. Total sorties: 26. 26 B-26's were over the Primary Target and 26 B-26's dropped 104 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .01 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 12:06 hours from 11,400' on an Axis of 22°T. 4 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs were salvoed at 11:40 hours at (W) V-9863 by the early return, with engineering trouble. No bombs were returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 26 B-26's returned to base at 13:20 hours.

ROUTE: Base to rendezvous with escort at Luneville (W) Q-0800; to St. Die; to Selestat (W) V-7962; to Haslach (W) W-2862; to Oppenau (W) W-3286; to Calw (W) R-7312; to Durmengen (W) R-7938; to IP, Germingen (W) R-9063; to target on an Axis of 22°T (briefed Axis - 23°T; drift correction - none; evasive action - loss of 1,000' altitude); breakaway left to Durmengen; reciprocal course to base.

WEATHER: Clear Vis. 5 - 6 miles in haze in all areas.

RESULTS: Target was missed. Bombs started short, walking to the bridge, with others cutting the west approach.
