NECKARFLZ RAILROAD BRIDGE (M/R: (W) S-069613, GSGS 4416, Sheet U-3), Germany.

At 10:40 hours, 30 B-26's took off to bomb Neckarflz Railroad Bridge (M/R: (W) S-069613, GSGS 4416, Sheet U-3), Germany. 3 B-26's returned early: spares. Total Sorties: 27. 27 B-26's were over the Primary target and 27 B-26's dropped 108 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .01 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 12:35 hours from 12,200' to 11,200' on an Axis of 23° T. No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 26 B-26's returned to base at 13:51 hours, and 1 B-26 landed at Colmar, condition of crew and a/c unknown.

ROUTE: Same as route used on Report No. 533, this date, except Axis here was  $23^{\circ}T$  (briefed Axis -  $23^{\circ}T$ ; drift correction -  $03^{\circ}$  right; evasive action - loss of 1,000' altitude).

WEATHER: Clear. Vis. 5 - 6 miles in haze in all areas.

RESULTS: An excellent pattern completely covered the bridge, scoring several direct hits. Crews reported seeing parts of the bridge flying through the air.

SPECIAL COMMENTS: Supplement Report On B-26 a/c lost on the 20 March 1945:

Two (2) Enlisted crew members have returned to this Headquarters for interrogation. They report a/c, Battle No. 77, hit three (3) times by flak over Lambrecht (W) H-2486. The first hit knocked out the right engine, at which time the right engine was feathered, bombs were salvoed and the order to "prepare to jump" was given. The third hit in the bombay, severed controls and a/c went into a dive. At 2,000' one of the three (3) crew members in the front of the a/c (name unknown) bailed out, followed by two (2) Enlisted men in the rear of the a/c. One of the men landed at (W) H-1807 and the other at (W) H-1308, in wooded areas. The a/c crashed and exploded at (W) H-1009. It was not subsequently examined by the Enlisted men. The Enlisted men were picked up by 3rd Army tanks. One of the Enlisted men visited the location of the third chute at (W) H-2207. A civilian attempting to recover the parachute stated he had directed the crew member to whom it belonged to the West toward the Allied lines. Crew members interrogated are Sgt. Arthur R. Cloey and Sgt. John W. Lester.
