320th Bombardment Group (M).

BIETIGIEN RAILROAD VIADUCT (M/R: (W) S-020405, GSGS 4416, Sheet V-3), Germany.

At 09:58 hours, 29 B-26's took off to bomb Bietigien Railroad Viaduct (M/R: (W) S-020405, GSGS 4416, Sheet V-3), Germany. 2 B-26's returned early: spares. Total Sorties: 27. 27 B-26's were over the Primary target on two bomb runs, and 9 B-26's dropped 36 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .01 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target on the first bomb run at 11:56 hours from 11,200' on an Axis of 212°T, and 9 B-26's dropped 36 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .01 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target on the second bomb run at 12:03 hours from 12,300' on an Axis of 210°T, not having been in position to drop on the first bomb run. No bombs were salvoed. 36 x 1,000-lb. Demolition bombs were returned to base by 9 B-26's, the second Squadron, which were not in position to drop on the first bomb run and did not identify the target on the second bomb run, and did not drop on the Alternate target, because the Flight Commander ordered them to return with the formation. No B-26's lost or missing. 1 B-26 slightly damaged by flak. 27 B-26's returned to base at 13:31 hours.

ROUTE: Base to rendezvous with escort at Luneville (W) Q-0800; to St. Die (W) V-4164; to Selestat (W) V-7962; to Haslach (W) W-2862; to Oppenau (W) W-3286; to Calw (W) R-7312; to Vaihingen (W) R-8237; to Bietigheim (W) S-0204; to Adelsfurt (W) S-2664; to IP, (W) S-1362; to target on an Axis of 210°T. on the first bomb run; curve right to IP; to target on Axis of 212°T. (Briefed Axis - 207°T; drift correction - 0 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° right; evasive action - loss of 700' altitude); breakaway left to Vaihingen (W) R-8273; reciprocal course to base.

(5) 2 locomotives with steam up, stationary, at Wildberg (W) R-0274 at 11:42 hours.

(6) Train of 50 RR cars, with locomotives on each end, stationary, locomotives had steam up, at Weil-Der-Stadt (W) R-6317 at 12:07 hours.

(7) Train of 20 RR cars moving in yards, 300 RR cars in yards, at Heilbronn (W) S-0862 at 11:28 hours.

(8) 100 RR cars scattered on tracks between target and 5 miles South at 11:58 hours.

CASUALTIES: None.

ROUTE: Route was the same as that of Mission Report No. 535, this date, except here only one bomb run was made on an Axis of 210°T; no drift corrections; evasive action - loss of 1,500' altitude.

WEATHER: Same as Report No. 535, this date.

RESULTS: An excellent pattern covered the target, scoring several direct hits.
