320th bombardment group (M).

HEILBRONN M/Y (M/R: (W) S-064604, GSGB 4416, sheet V-3), Germany.

At 10:39 Hours, 30 B-26's took off to bomb Heilbronn M/Y (M/R: (W) S-064604, GSGB 4416, sheet V-3), germany. 4 B-26's returned early: 1 engineering; 3 spares. Total sorties: 26. 26 B-26's were over the Primary target on two bomb runs and 26 B-26's dropped 204 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .01 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 13:27 hours from 12,000' to 11,000' on an axis of 168°. No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 21 B-26's returned to base at 15:13 hours and 5 B-26's returned between 16:30 hours and 17:15 hours after landing at Luneville for fuel.

AIR OBSERVATIONS:

a. Activity: P-47's provided escort.

b. Situation:

(1) A bailed-in C-47 was seen at field at (W) Q-5341 at 14:01 hours.

(2) A crashed B-26 on the ground at (W) M-4628 at 12:22 hours.

ENEMY AIR ENCOUNTERS: None. Losses to E/A: None. Damaged by E/A: None. Claimed E/A: None.

FLAK: None. Losses to Flak: None. Damaged by Flak: None.

GROUND OBSERVATIONS:

a. General:

(1) 30/40 small black puffs at 1,500' were drifting at (W) S-0974 at 13:26 hours; not believed, by observer, to be flak.

(2) 18 barges at target at 13:27 hours.

(3) 20 barges between target and Neckarlez (W) R-9984 at 13:27 hours.

(4) 5 buildings and gun emplacements south-east of the target at (W) S-1855 at 13:27 hours.

b. Communications:

(1) 200 RR cars at target at 13:27 hours.

(2) 100 RR cars at (W) S-2062 at 13:28 hours.

(3) 50 cars marked with red crosses at Neudeman (W) S-1273 at 13:30 hours.

CASUALTIES: None.

ROUTE: Base to rendezvous with escort at Luneville (W) Q-0800; to Zweibruecken (W) Q-7372; to Kaiserauern (W) R-0294; to Alzey (W) M-2729; to Bickenbach (W) M-6329; to Hetsbach (W) M-9011; to IP, Auerbach, (W) S-0890; to target on the first bomb run; curve left to IP; second bomb run to target on an Axis of 168°T (briefed Axis - 184°T; drift correction - 03° right; evasive action - loss of 1,000' altitude); breakaway left to Auerbach; reciprocal course to base.

WEATHER:

- a. enroute : 8-9/10ths stratocumulus, base varying between 3,000' and 4000', tops 8,000', with occasional thin patches of altostratus at 8,000'.
- b. Vicinity of Target :)- 8-9/10ths stratocumulus, tops 8,000'. Few
- c. Target Area : breaks over the target.
- d. Return : AS enroute.

RESULTS: The bombs of first 2 Squadrons started just "orth of the target and walked through the east end, across large concentration of AA cars. Bombs of 3rd Squadron cut through the west end of the yards.
