KLEIN ENSTINGEN AMMUNITION STORAGE AREA, EAST $\frac{1}{2}$ OF AREA "F" (M/R: (N) X-150750, GSGB 4416, Sheet W-3), Germany.

At 09:30 hours, 20 B-26's took off to bomb Klein Enstingen Ammunition Storage Area, East $\frac{1}{2}$ of Area "F" (M/R: (N) X-150750, GSGB 4416, Sheet W-3), Germany. 2 B-26's returned early: spares. Total sorties: 18. 18 B-26's were over the Primary target and 18 B-26's dropped 144 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .025 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 12:00 hours from 10,400' to 9,500' on an Axis of 154°T, on the third bomb run, necessitated by cloud cover and haze on the first two runs. The formation was over the target at 11:37 hours and 11:44 hours on the first two bomb runs. No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 18 B-26's returned to base at 13:22 hours.

RESULTS: An excellent concentration of bombs covered the target, causing a tremendous explosion, with smoke reaching 6,000'.
