STRASS AMMUNITION DUMP, EAST HALF OF AREA #1 (M/R: (W) X-790820, GSOS 4416, sheet W-4), Germany.

320th Bombardment Group (M).

At 11:24 hours, 39 B-26's took off to bomb Strass Ammo Dump - East half of Area #1, (M/R: (W) X-790820, GSOS 4416, sheet W-4), Germany. 3 B-26's returned early; Spares. Total Sorties: 36. 36 B-26's were over the primary target and 36 B-26's dropped 144 x 1,000-lb demolition bombs (.1 & .01 second delay tail fuses) on the primary target at 13:51 hours at 12,000' to 11,000' on an axis of 226 Deg. True. No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing and no B-26's damaged. 36 B-26's returned to base at 15:33 hours.

- a. Activity: 12 P-47's escorted formation but were 15 minutes late for rendezvous. 2 B-17's, one of which had an engine smoking headed west at 12,000' at 13:10 hours.
