320th Bombardment Group (M).

STRASS AMMUNITION DUMP, AREA #4 (M/R: (W) X-790820, GSOS 4416, Sheet W-4), Germany.

At 12:43 hours, 20 B-26's took off to bomb Strass Ammunition Dump, Area #4 (M/R: (W) X-790820, GSOS 4416, Sheet W-4), Germany. 2 B-26's returned early: Spares. Total Sorties: 18. 18 B-26's were over the Primary target and 18 B-26's dropped 136 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .025 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 14:47 hours from 13,090' to 12,000' on an Axis of 181°T (briefed Axis - 177°T; drift correction - 02° right; evasive action - loss of 1,000' altitude). 2 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs were salvoed at 14:47 hours at the target, having hung up. No bombs were returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 18 B-26's returned to base at 16:11 hours.
