At 07:20 hours, 18 B-26's took off to bomb Jaffe Defense Area, Area "A" (M/R: (V) Y-385790, CGGS 4249, Sheet 6M), France. No B-26's returned early. Total Sorties: 18. 18 B-26's were over the Primary target and 18 B-26's dropped 36 x 2,000-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .025 second delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 09:14 hours from 11,350' on an Axis of 252°T (briefed Axis - 254°T; drift correction - 02° right; evasive action - loss of altitude). No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 18 B-26's returned to base at 10:50 hours.
