INGOLSTADT KOECHING AMMUNITION DUMP, AREA "D" (M/R: (W) T-744279, GSOS 4416, Sheet V6), Germany.

At 11:44 hours, 20 B-26's took off to bomb Ingolstadt Koeching Ammunition Dump, Area "D" (M/R: (W) T-744279, GSOS 4416, Sheet V6), Germany. 2 B-26's returned early: spares. Total Sorties: 18. 18 B-26's were over the Primary target on two (2) bomb-runs. 9 B-26's dropped 122 x 260-lb. Fragmentation bombs (Inst. nose & non-delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 14:09 hours from 11,200' on an Axis of 110°T (briefed Axis - 110°T; drift correction - 02°; evasive action - loss of altitude) on the first bomb-run. 18 B-26's were over the Primary target and 9 B-26's dropped 124 x 260-lb. Fragmentation bombs (Inst. Nose & non-delay tail fuses) on the Primary target at 14:20 hours from 11,000' on an axis of 111°T (briefed Axis - 111°T; drift correction - 03° right; evasive action - loss of altitude) on the second bomb-run. No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. No B-26's lost. 1 B-26 is at Mannheim for fuel. 16 B-26's returned to base at 16:18 hours. 1 B-26 returned to base late at 18:00 hours after landing at Mannheim for gas. No B-26's damaged.
