SCHWABMURCHEN ANNO DUMP, AREA WAW, (M/R: (W) Y-318547, GSGS 4416, Shoot M5), Germany.

3 B-26's took off to bomb schwahmunchen Ammo Dump, Germany. No B-26's returned early. Total sorties: 3. 3 B-26's dropped 40 x 250 lb demolition bombs (.1, .025 second delay tail fuses) on the primary target at 1044 hours from 11,500' on an axis of 2350 T, (Briefed axis - 238 deg. T; Brift correction - Rone; Evasive action - loss of altitude). No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. (Lead A/C (Bat) carried only 12 bombs). No B-26's were lost and no B-26's are missing. No B-26's were damaged. 3 B-26's returned to base at 1222 hours.
